



Select "My Maps" on the top left-hand side of the screen:



Next, select "Published Maps" from the options pane:




## **Map Search**



#### **Editing Tips**

- The target population for each district is 13,532. Deviation of 5% to 10% may be considered.
- To see what the population within a Census Block is before assigning it to a
  District, hover the cursor over the Census Block. Population and demographic
  statistics for the Census Block will appear in the "Block Details" box.
- To change the District a Census Block has been assigned to, use the paint brush tool to select the District in the District Selector box you want to change the Census Block to and then click on the Census Block you want to change. You may also select "Un" (Unassigned) in the District Selector box and click on a Census Block to leave it unassigned.



#### **Tips for Quality Maps**


- Districts are compact (uniform shapes, recognizable shapes, not elongated or thinly sliced across the jurisdiction)
- Districts are contiguous (share a common border).
- Districts are relatively equal in population, with a deviation no greater than 10% from the least populated to the greatest populated district. For example, if the ideal district should contain 1000 people, you could have one district that contains 950 people (5% under the ideal) and one district that contains 1050 people (5% over the ideal), with the other districts falling somewhere in between. The total deviation would be an acceptable 10%. You can check your percentages by clicking on "statistics" on the right-hand side of the tool bar.
- Districts keep neighborhoods and other communities of interest, like territories around schools, around landmarks, etc., together






## **Finalize Map**


